

A list of numbers currently allocated to you can be downloaded daily.

The file generated will be named num-cliextXXXX-YYYYMMDD.txt where:

XXXX is your Magrathea Client number

YYYYMMDD is the date that the file was generated

For example, for client '2' on the 1<sup>st</sup> July 2011:

num-cliext2-20110701.txt

This file will be compressed into a ZIP file of the same name (but .zip extension instead of .txt)

num-cliext2-20110701.zip

The file name shows the date on which it was GENERATED and it will contain the list of numbers as at that moment in time.

Within the file, the first line is always a header line. After this, each line represents a single number allocated to your Client reference and contains a comma separated list of columns

The columns that are available for this download type are:

| Name        | Data type   | Description   |
|-------------|-------------|---|
| Account     | Varchar(21) | The allocated number  |
| Provisioned | Date        | The date the number was activated (dd/mm/yyyy)<br>NOTE: If you ACTI an already active number, this date will be updated   |
| Changed     | Date        | The date the number was last modified (dd/mm/yyyy).<br>If this number is not linked to another account, this field will be updated each time the number receives a valid call.<br>This can also be the date when the NTSAPI is used to enable or disable the number.  |
| Expires     | Date        | The date the number will expire and cease to work (dd/mm/yyyy)  |
| Target1     | Varchar(80) | First target stored. This could be SIP (S:), IAX (I:) or an NTS target  |
| Target2     | Varchar(80) | Second target stored.   |
| Target3     | Varchar(80) | Third target stored.  |
| Ported      | Varchar(10) | Indicates whether this number is ported to Magrathea or is an on-net number. Possible values:<br>Y – Ported<br>N – On-net (Magrathea) number<br>Unknown – please check with Support   |
| Block       | Varchar(10) | Indicates whether the number is a single number (value N) or part of a block. When it is part of a block, it will be shown in the form B:XXX:YYY where XXX is the size of the block and YYY is the number within the block.<br>So a value of “B:10:2” means this is the second number in a block of ten numbers.  |
| 999STATUS   | Varchar(10) | Indicates the status of any 999 Data submitted for this number. Please refer to the NTSAPI guide “INFO <number> 999 STATUS “ for details of response values The most important are:<br>0 – this means data was accepted by the EHA<br>9:None – no data has been stored for this number<br>In addition, you may see the following<br>P – Name/Postcode only is present<br><b>For Ported numbers the Name and Postcode is automatically sent to the EHA to allow the import of data from the losing CP to Magrathea when the port completes. Numbers which have a 999STATUS of ‘P’ MUST be updated with a full address as soon as possible.</b> |
| 999DATA     | Date        | Where data was accepted by the EHA, this includes the date (dd/mm/yyyy) of the last acceptance received from the EHA to help with auditing and finding older data which may require updating.   |
